

IDSA Comments on Senate Bills Falling Short on Pandemic, AMR Challenges: IDSA appreciates increased funding for many domestic and global infectious diseases programs included in <u>recent Senate appropriations bills</u>, but is disappointed the bills lack expanded investments needed in the ongoing fight against COVID-19 and to combat the growing AMR crisis.

CPT Codes for COVID-19 Vaccines Just Released: The CPT Editorial Panel approved <u>CPT codes and guidance</u> for two coronavirus vaccines, along with administration codes. The new CPT codes are unique to each vaccine to provide more precise tracking and reporting. The codes were released prior to public availability to facilitate updates to health care electronic systems across the country.
